#### IDENTIFYING DECOMPOSITION STAGES TO AID IN TIME OF DEATH DETERMINATIONS

An issue when investigating poaching of many wildlife species is the discovery of carcasses in advanced stages of decomposition with little information about time of death (TOD). Documenting decomposition changes over time can provide markers for wildlife law enforcement officials to aid in TOD determinations. A decomposition project was conducted to provide baseline data on long term decomposition. Decomposition data has been collected from eight wolves, four mountain lions, two black bears, and a whitetail deer providing material for this manual.
